


The Year 2/3 class from Howrah sent a package via mail in November and tracked its journey across Australia. When it arrived nearly two weeks later, we were surprised how long it had taken but were very excited to read the letters written by the students in our new buddy class in Tassie!

The connection with same age students in a different state provoked a lot of questioning about the similarities and differences between places, how other people live and the diversity of our country. We focused our thinking on questions with answers that were not "Googleable", to gain deeper understanding of what it is like to live and attend school in Tasmania. We have continued to communicate with our 'inquiry pals' through email, responding to questions about our local flora and fauna, comparing school timetables and activities, and finding out about the beaches in Tasmania!


