Parking at Busy Times

Our new crossing on Chandler Ave will be in operation soon. Main Roads are completing the signage next week and the Town of Cambridge will need to install additional signs after that. Main Roads will also be training our Warden who will be present during busy times before and after school. We will keep you updated as we receive information.

Parking around all schools during drop off and pick up times is always busy and Floreat is no exception. We have had reported parking behaviours that pose serious threat to the safety of your children. So that we can keep our students safe we ask all parents to:

- Allow plenty of time for drop off and pick up; it is unreasonable to expect this process will be quick
- Be patient
- Adhere to the parking restrictions detailed on signs
- Drive slowly
- If you have older children consider other drop off/pick up points away from the school, or agree a later pick up time

Mrs Rowlands, Mr Cohen and Mr Walters will be present when possible. The Town of Cambridge Ranger is also very supportive and vigilant during these times. Thank you in advance for your attention to this very important matter.



Student Health Care and Anaphylaxis Management

The physical and mental well-being of your child/children is of utmost importance to us. It is vital that we share important information so that we can provide the necessary duty of care for every child.

Student health forms were distributed on the first day of term. Please ensure these are completed and returned as soon as possible. If your child requires medication to be kept at school e.g. puffers, EpiPen® or Anapen®, please supply this to Rod Cohen through the office so we can store it in the appropriate place and develop a Student Health Care Plan.

Student Services Team

Our Student Services team is comprised of Rod Cohen (Deputy Principal), Fiona Farley, Jodie Bell (new School Psychologist), Emily Eldridge and Sue Robinson (Chaplain).

Our brief is to facilitate the well-being of your children. This is undertaken in a variety of ways.

Emily is driving the new 'Bounce Back' program which focusses on resilience and emotional well-being.

Rod and Fiona assist staff in planning for special needs children.

Rod oversees the organising of the health needs of our students including medical plans and medications.

Our school chaplain is available to assist children with their concerns. She promotes relational skills and encourages positive self-development.

Teachers can make referrals to our school psychologist. Parents can approach the class teacher should they consider that their child's school related issues (learning difficulties, emotional problems) may warrant intervention from the school psychologist.
