We are due to introduce the online format next year as part of the Department's roll out of the program.

It was fantastic to see so many parents at that meeting held at the Kindergarten. 


We are very proud of the way our Student Council organised the event which raised a whopping **\$719.00**!

Lapathon 2018

It's that time of year again. The Lapathon is the FPPS P&C Main Fundraiser for 2018 and will be held on Wednesday 13th June. It will be a great day of fun and entertainment.

The FPPS P&C are aiming to raise \$20,000 at this year's Lapathon to improve play spaces around the school grounds. The P&C are raising funds to support the ongoing development of children's play spaces around school. Last year's Lapathon fundraising supported the significant extension of the play equipment on the school oval, which are currently being fabricated and will be installed during the next holidays.

The play spaces development is now focusing on the outdoor learning area and the creation of more small scale games and passive recreational spaces for students. We hope to create a covered space where the vegetable gardens were previously so that students can have a quiet, calm space to talk, read and relax. Furthermore, once the new play equipment is installed on the school oval, we will be looking to fund a new shade sail, similar to the ones covering the current equipment.

AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS

Rotary Cambridge Guest Speaker: Georgia Garratt, Clinical Lead Autism Research Team, Telethonkids Institute

The Autism Research Team at the Telethonkids Institute is investigating the genetic and neurodevelopmental causes of Autism and language impairment, and is conducting clinical intervention trials into Autism Spectrum Disorders.

The Rotary Club of Cambridge is delighted that on Wednesday 30 May Speech Pathologist Georgia Garratt will be the guest speaker at the Club's second Schools' Programme talk of the 2018 academic year.

Georgia is Clinical Lead of the Telethonkids Institute's Autism Research Team which, lead by Professor Andrew Whitehouse, is seeking to discover new ways to identify Autism Spectrum Disorders as early as possible and to develop innovative methods to help children with Autism to reach their full potential.

Georgia holds a Master's Degree in Autism Studies – her research for her degree investigated inclusive education for students with Autism Spectrum Disorders. She has spent a number of years working alongside teachers to facilitate positive outcomes for students with Autism.

We use a number of methods to communicate with parents to help let you know what is happening in the school and with your children:




