ACKNOWLEDGING HARMONY WEEK

What is the Role of a Chaplain?

School Chaplains are responsible for supporting the social, and emotional wellbeing of their students regardless of faith or beliefs. They can become involved in a wide variety of issues including health, social and values education and emotional support.

CHAPLAIN'S ROLE:

To support students, staff and School community.

The day-to-day role of the School Chaplain is to provide pastoral care to students, staff and the wider School community. Chaplaincy is about serving others, a concept that often runs contrary to the mind-set of modern society.

Pastoral care can best be described as being present for others during their life experiences, especially difficult times. The military call this "loitering with intent". Pastoral care includes a wide variety of areas including physical and mental health, social and values education, behaviour management and emotional support. The School Chaplain is a person who has time to sit and listen to people.

This could just be a general chat or by appointment for a range of specific reasons including, but not limited to:

- Experiencing difficulties at home.
- Social and relational issues at school or in general.
- Developing resilience and other social and emotional skills.
- Exploring self-identity and self-development issues.
- Talking about general worries and concerns.
- Responding to critical incidents as part of the School's support team.

Chaplains deliver their services with RESPECT - COMPASSION - SERVICE:

- Chaplains respect the diversity of views within the communities they serve.
- Chaplains reach out to those in need to inspire hope.
- Chaplains serve, create partnerships and recognise the contribution of others.

Assisting students to address difficult social issues by:

- Building relationships with students, families and staff.
- Offering pastoral care.
- Being a mentor.
- Providing additional practical help to teaching and administrative staff.
- Offering input into spiritual and "meaning of life" questions.
- Being a positive role model.
- Providing specific input as requested by the school

Award-winning Bounce Back! is the world's first Positive Psychology Education program. It consists of practical resources and strategies designed to teach social and emotional learning skills within a school environment, and to support and promote student wellbeing and resilience.

This year we are introducing the whole school resilience program "Bounce Back". Today staff members will have a training session to

• gain an understanding of the psychological principles and research that underpin the program



- develop a sound understanding of the program's core structure and curriculum units, as well as teachingstrategies for fostering student wellbeing and resilience, develop a greater awareness of strategies for using children's literature to teach key wellbeing and resilience concepts and
- gain the knowledge to implement the Bounce Back! program within the classroom and across the school.

Our presenter, Rachelle Allen, has been working in the health and education sector for over 14 years. As a teacher, Rachelle specialised in the of health and wellbeing, behaviour areas management and engaging disengaged students through the use of digital technology. Since leaving the school environment, Rachelle has worked extensively as a trainer/facilitator in the field of mental health. Most recently Rachelle has been bringing her expertise of health and wellbeing to the area of cyber safety and digital citizenship

HELPING CHILDREN TO BE MORE RESILIENT & SELF CONFIDENT

Rotary Cambridge Guest Speaker : Helen Davidson, Children's Clinician

The Rotary Club of Cambridge is pleased that children's Clinician Helen Davidson will be the guest speaker at the Club's first Schools' Programme talk for the 2018 academic year. Helen will be talking about helping children to be more resilient, self confident and socially comfortable.



Helen has been working in children's mental health since 1990, having taken up a position at Princess Margaret Hospital. From the moment that she stepped through the hospital's doors, she knew she had found her passion. As an Occupational Therapist who had been working with blind and visually impaired children, Helen had long had an interest in what helped some children to survive and thrive despite sometimes difficult and even dire circumstances, while others with seemingly greater advantage did not

A Masters Degree in Counselling, a Diploma in Family Therapy and further postgraduate study followed whilst Helen worked in all areas of children's mental health from the crisis end of suicide assessment and treatment to eating disorders, anxiety and depression, in both Australia and the UK. Helen and her co-author Claire Orange have published a number of books through their BEST Programs 4 Kids initiative.

Helen's topic is huge - many children struggle to cope with being shy, with lacking self confidence, with being at a disadvantage in social situations often lonely and isolated – and sadly also with being bullied.
