Floreat Girls STEAM Ahead

Last week Floreat entered a Year 6 team in the STEAMing Ahead Competition held at St Mary's Girls' School. The competition provides girls with the opportunity to solve complex STEM problems and encourages them to continue their interest in STEM subjects in high school and university. Their report is below.

A favourite challenge was the Archimedes Screw Challenge. We had to wrap a pipe in plastic tubing and then turn it round in the water. The challenge was to collect the most water from the lower bucket and turn it into the higher bucket. Lily and Ruby won the challenge for the



most water collected and received movie vouchers.

We learnt a lot about team work. We split jobs and the team selected the person who was best for the job even if that person was a bit reluctant; not everyone wants to do the writing.

Public Speaking

A number of Year 6 students have been involved in a Public Speaking extension course with Mrs Parks, a public speaking and debating coach, who also adjudicates speaking competitions.

We used mind maps to brainstorm ideas which we discussed with each other. Mrs Parks taught us how to grasp the audience's attention and deliver a speech that would be entertaining.

We learnt that it's a good idea to avoid nervous people before you speak as they may put you off. Standing with two feet slightly apart will prevent swaying and it is unwise to use a rhetorical question as the audience will be thinking about the question instead of the speech.


