Floreat Park Primary School is Targeting Handwashing!

Hand washing is an important public health measure for reducing the impact of some communicable diseases such as gastroenteritis and influenza which can severely impact student attendance, learning and the wellbeing of the school community. Hand washing can also reduce the risk of exposure to common allergens such as peanuts for those in the school community who are anaphylactic, and decrease the risk of cross infection for students with chronic health conditions such as cystic fibrosis.

It is recommended that students to wash their hands:

- □ Immediately after visiting the toilet
- □ Before preparing food
- $\hfill\square$ Before and after eating food
- □ After being exposed to respiratory or other body fluids e.g. coughing or blowing their nose
- □ After playing sport
- $\hfill\square$ At any other time when the hands are soiled.

The Department of Health recommends the following steps:

- □ Wet hands, preferably with warm water
- □ Apply hand washing agent, e.g. soap, liquid soap
- $\hfill\square$ Lather the hands and fingers for at least 15 seconds
- $\hfill\square$ Rinse hands under running water

 $\hfill\square$ Where possible, taps in public toilets should be turned off using a paper towel to avoid possible re-contamination of hands


 \Box Alternatively, hands can be cleaned using alcohol based products (gels, rinses, foams) containing an emollient that does not require the use of water.







A hand wash should take around 30 seconds.




Wet hands with running water (preferably warm, for comfort).

back of hands,





Lapathon 2018

It's that time of year again. The Lapathon is the FPPS P&C Main Fundraiser for 2018 and will be held on Wednesday 13^{th} June. It will be a great day of fun and entertainment.

The FPPS P&C are aiming to raise \$20,000 at this year's Lapathon to improve play spaces around the school grounds. The P&C are raising funds to support the ongoing development of children's play spaces around school. Last year's Lapathon fundraising supported the significant extension of the play equipment on the school oval, which are currently being fabricated and will be installed during the next holidays.

The play spaces development is now focusing on the outdoor learning area and the creation of more small scale games and passive recreational spaces for students. We hope to create a covered space where the vegetable gardens were previously so that students can have a quiet, calm space to talk, read and relax. Furthermore, once the new play equipment is installed on the school oval, we will be looking to fund a new shade sail, similar to the ones covering the current equipment.

Registration is \$79 for one registration; family discount applies when registering more than one family member.



We use a number of methods to communicate with parents to help let you know what is happening in the school and with your children:


